3. Paul wrote this letter as a prisoner, and yet he recognized his sufferings were part of God's plan for his life and good came from his trials. What trial(s) or difficult situations are you facing? Even harder, how might you be able to see them for God's Glory and for his story?
4. The Great Mystery is uncovered in verse 6, Jews and Gentiles are one in Jesus, joined together in the church, both heirs. This was shocking to many Jews, who pride themselves in their rich history and could easily find themselves feeling better than others. What does that mean for you today? How might this great mystery impact you and how you see others?
